2. Ourad ZX 13279 of 7 July, subject: Return of Korean repats and Korean illegal immigrants to Pusan from Japan, states in future, notification concerning instructions to JG to outload above mentioned individuals will refer to cite number (ZX 13279) and state only name of ship, ETD Sasebo and ETA Pusan. Radio:

a. Informs Eighth Army, unless otherwise specified in notification, no U.S. guards will be placed aboard ships, and requests CG XXIV Corps be notified of actual number persons embarked.

b. Informs CG XXIV Corps that, unless otherwise specified in notification, ships are available for transporting repatriates destined Japan.

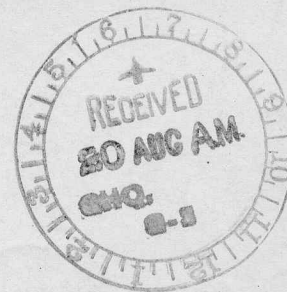

 - c. Amend existing instructions providing that Allied guards accompany Korean illegal immigrants to Pusan.
2. Memo for JG, SCAPIN 1391 (Tab A).
 - a. States since cholera is still prevalent in Korea, positive steps must be continued to detect and apprehend ships which are illegally transporting persons from Korea to Japan.
 - b. Directs JG to:
 - (1) Continue in effect measures to detect ships illegally entering Jap ports.
 - (2) Seize all such ships and passengers.
 - (3) Place all Korean illegal immigrants apprehended in Japan in cholera quarantine and otherwise medically process them; upon clearance by quarantine officials, transport them to the Sasebo Reception Center by rail.
 - (4) Outload Korean illegal immigrants from the Sasebo Reception Center on shipping designated for this purpose.
 - (5) Furnish Jap police guards aboard trains and ships transporting Korean illegal immigrants.
 - c. States (in para 5): "Necessary Allied guards to lend the necessary support and prestige to Japanese police guards and coordinate their activities may be secured on request to the local Allied Commander". (This includes guards on ships).
3. Letter to Eighth Army, enclosing SCAPIN 1391, in paragraph 3 b requests: "That necessary Allied guards be furnished upon request of the Imperial Japanese Government to insure delivery of Korean illegal immigrants to the Sasebo Reception Center and to the custody of the Commanding General, United States Army Forces in Korea. The number of Allied guards furnished is left to the discretion of the local Allied Commander."
4. Each time in the past a ship has been set up to transport Koreans, it has necessitated a memo to JG (Tab B) and an involved radio to interested persons (Tab C). Ships have been set up about every 10 days. If

instructions to JG are verbal, it will eliminate much administrative work and save paper. By shortening notification to interested headquarters to read essentially "Reourad ZX _____ of _____ July 47, _____ Maru departs Sasebo _____, ETA Pusan _____", it will result in less congestion of radio traffic.

5. Reference paragraph 2 c and 3 above, it has not been the policy for some time to place US guards on ships carrying Korean illegal immigrants to Korea (see para 4 of Tab A, and 2nd paragraph of Tab B). However, it is still desirable to have Allied guards aboard trains.

6. RECOMMENDED ACTION:

a. Amending SCAPIN 1391 and ltr to Eighth Army to state US guards will be made available only on trains.

b. Informing JG that instructions re future shipments of Korean repats and illegal immigrants will be verbal.

c. Giving US agencies an SOP to shorten future radios.

7. CONCURRENCE: G-1 (Capt Holland).

8. RECOMMENDATION: Approval and dispatch of attached radio, letter to Eighth Army and memo to JG.

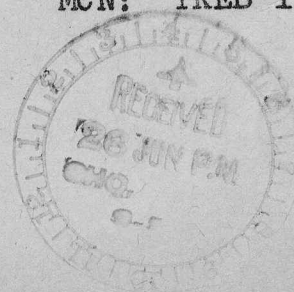

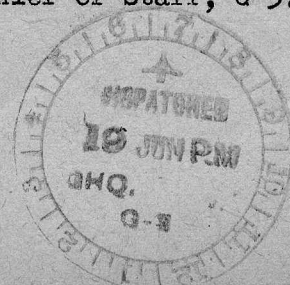

1. BASIC ACTION: Action initiated in G-3, in conjunction with G-1 and CPC to: ship Korean illegal immigrants and Korean repatriates, now held at Sasebo, to Pusan (par 2 below); ship authorized baggage of Koreans, previously repatriated to Korea, from Moji to Pusan (par 3 below).

2. As of 11 June, there are 812 S. Koreans and 112 illegal immigrants at Sasebo (24 Div radio KVC 6871 of 12 June 47).

3. During time that Korean repats were allowed to take to S. Korea only the amount of baggage they could carry with them, excess items were taken up and stored in warehouse #13 at the Hakata Reception Center. After baggage allowances were increased, the items were still held. After closing of the Hakata Reception Center, the baggage was moved to Moji warehouses (Maj Duff, Eighth Army) and Maj Goff, USAMGIK Ln O). The baggage has been inspected by CPC (per Mr. Mayall, Fn. Exchange Assets Branch) and found to be practically valueless. It has been inspected by USAMGIK Ln O, Osaka, Eighth Army MG unit, and JG to insure only authorized property is included.

4. SCAJAP by separate action is designating the Kogane Maru to lift persons and property mentioned in par 1 above.

5. RECOMMENDED ACTION: JG be instructed to place Koreans and property aboard Kogane Maru; informing Eighth Army; informing CG XXIV Corps ship available to carry repats destined Japan.

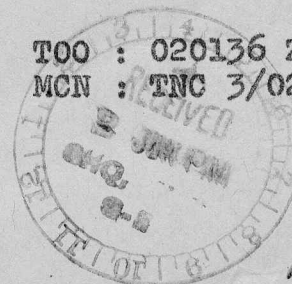

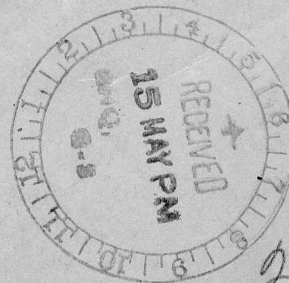

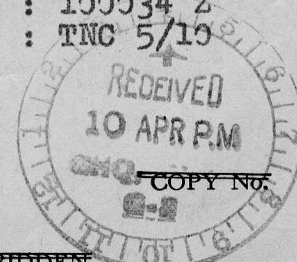
