COMMENT

ALIENS: POLICE CONDUCT LARGE-SCALE SEARCH OF KOREAN RESIDENCES IN CHIBA

"Under the direction of Police Chief Seiichi SASA of the Chiba Police Station, more than a hundred policemen conducted a wholesale search 15 August of the Korean Residents' Association Office and some 30 Korean residences in Chiba City.

"According to an investigation conducted by the Chiba Chapter of the Korean Democratic Youth Association, (List: XB 76) executive members both of the Korean Residents Association and the Korean Democratic Youth Association were absent from their main offices on the second anniversary of Korea's liberation, 15 August. On that morning 15 armed policemen, led by Chief SASA, entered the office and conducted a thorough search, breaking the locks on two file cabinets. They also broke into the warehouse and examined the goods therein. Seals on official documents were also broken.

"In the meantime, groups of 30 to 45 policemen forced their way into 30 Korean houses at Imai-cho, Minato-machi, and Kameoka-machi the same afternoon. Without removing their shoes, they broke into dwellings, searching for staple foodstuffs, tobacco, and clothes. In the house of Tu Han CHYONG, of 58, Minato-machi, they searched for cash. Nevertheless, they found no suspicious goods.

"Student representatives of the Korean Residents Association immediately filed a strong protest with the police department.

"In regard to this affair, the Tokyo Headquarters of the Korean Residents' Association issued the following statement:

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"Not only is this a Fascistic act perpetrated in the spirit of the old special police, but it is also an act deliberately calculated to impair racial friendship and infringe on the people's rights. Such acts will form a cancer hindering the democratic reconstruction of Japan."

"At the same time, the Korean Residents' Association submitted the following three-point demand to the Japanese Government:

1. The authorities shall clarify the reasons for the police search of the Korean residences and the office of the Korean Residents' Association on the second anniversary of the Korean Liberation.
2. The policemen, including the police chief, responsible for the case shall resign immediately.
3. The authorities shall guarantee that such illegal searches shall not be conducted again."

Since about May 1946, I have been out of a job and hard up and, at last, was obliged to borrow ¥8,000 in all from Mr. OHARA on the security of Shares etc. etc."

COMMENT

NARCOTICS: REPORT ON INQUIRY INTO PERSONS SUSPECTED OF ILLEGAL NARCOTIC TRANSACTIONS IN KYOTO-FU

In compliance with addressee's order, writer reports on inquiry of the suspects of illegal narcotic transactions which reads as follows:

"(A) 1. Name and address of the suspect.

HASHIMOTO Isoji, born on Sept 20, 1916, c/o YAMANAKA Yoshiko, 890, Fukakusa Nanasegawa-cho, Fushimi-ku, Kyoto-shi.

2. Reason for suspicion.

He got acquainted with a man named TODA Michimasa (aged about 44), repatriating to Kanazawa-shi (Ishikawa-ken), from Peking. He happened to meet TODA in Osaka, who asked him if there was any one who wanted to buy a stock of morphine which a doctor in Kanazawa-shi possessed. About November, 1946, he sent a letter to YAMAMOTO Shin-ichi, c/o YAMAMOTO Pharmacy, Shihiro-dori, Kiyokawa Kami-machi, Fukui-shi, which reads, 'A certain doctor in Kanazawa-shi has a stock of morphine. Can you find a buyer for it? As I cannot deal in morphine in Osaka because it impairs my credit, please find a buyer among your acquaintances. As I don't know the quotation of the drug, please fix the price as you think proper.' He said that this letter reached YAMAMOTO at the beginning of January, 1947. HASHIMOTO sent the above letter, but he was never shown the said morphine by TODA, and therefore, there is no evidence of transaction. The case seems to have been investigated by the Public Safety Section of the Military Government Team.

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(B) 1. Name and address of the suspect.

ITO Hiroshi, born on Apr 5, 1886, c/o ASAMI Yosakichi, Nishimae-cho, Bukkoji-Agaru, Takakura-dori, Shimokyo-ku, Kyoto-shi.

2. Reason for suspicion:

When he had a talk with TANIDA Tamio's son (name unknown, about 30-year-old pharmacist) in his native place, he heard that cocaine hydrochloride could be sold at an expensive price. Being inquired about cocaine hydrochloride by TANIDA's son in November or December, 1946, he went to the blackmarket at Shichijo, Kyoto-shi and asked a Korean blackmarketeer about the price and was told that it cost about ¥2,000 per ounce if its manufactory could be ascertained. He wrote to TANIDA's son about this matter around December, 1946. When he returned home afterwards and met TANIDA's son, he was told that the letter had not been received, and that he had been examined several times by the police. He had only communicated with him about the price of cocaine hydrochloride and possessed nothing of the kind. So no evidence of its transaction can be found.²

ESCAPES, ESCAPEES:POSSIBLE LEAD TO WHEREABOUTS OF MURDERER
OF GI AND TWO KOREANS

Writer states:

"Have you heard anything from Kiyoshi since then? Has she already come back to your house or is she still with MACHII? I pray to God she is not with MACHII, because MACHII is now wanted not only by the Allied Forces but also by the Japanese police and CHOSEN REMMEI (Korean League) as a robber and murderer.

"Recently, MACHII broke into the Korean League office to steal money, and, on leaving shot two Koreans to death with his pistol. Consequently, he is wanted by the Metropolitan Police Board. It is also said that the decision has been made secretly among Koreans that he shall be killed by their hands for the good of Koreans as soon as he is found out. Besides, at Tokyo Station he struck an American soldier to death because the GI bantered with his mistress."

TSUSHIMA ISLAND

The communication discloses smuggling activities at Tsushima Island, Nagasaki-ken as follows:

"...Smugglers' names and addresses:

"On several occasions during last July or August, the above-mentioned persons brought over seven or eight hundred thousand yen (¥700,000 or ¥800,000) worth of stationery from Nagasaki. They have been secretly exchanging these goods for rice and other commodities which were brought in by Koreans to Nahoura, Koto-mura by motor-boats from Fusan, Korea..."

COMMENTFOOD AND LIVING CONDITIONS:**SHIZUOKA POLICE SEARCH LUGGAGE OF TRAIN PASSENGERS FOR FOODSTUFFS**

"The Shizuoka Prefectural Police examined the contents of the luggage of passengers on trains from 21st of December to the 26th to uncover foodstuffs being illegally exported from the prefecture. 2,559 passengers were found guilty at the Hamamatsu Station. 6,811 kan of tangerines were discovered, 1,978 kilograms of rice and wheat, 1,453 kan of fresh fish, 858 kan of dried fish, 2,018 kilograms of salt. These were compulsorily purchased by the police. 350 black-market brokers were sent to the public procurator's office. The goods collected will be distributed to worthy citizens." (Ex: 1 kan equals 8.3 lbs.)

ALIENS: STATISTICS ON CRIMES BY KOREANS, FORMOSANS AND CHINESE

Writer reports that from Sep 45 to Jul 46 Koreans in Aichi, Miye, Ishikawa, and Toyama Prefectures were involved in the following criminal cases: Interference with officials in exercising duties - 1, escape - 8, harboring criminals - 1, accidental fire - 3, intrusion - 3, counterfeiting - 3, infliction of injury - 1, gambling - 106, bribery - 2, murder - 9, assault - 25, assault and murder - 2, accidental homicide - 12, accidental infliction injury - 13, larceny - 587, rape - 15, robbery - 17, robbery and assault - 5, robbery and murder - 4, fraud - 62, intimidation - 53, embezzlement - 13, fence - 50, destruction of property - 1, National Mobilization Law violation - 154, Commodity Price Control Law violation - 7, Food Control Law violation - 166, economic law violation - 5, anti-violence law violation - 3, Methyl Alcohol Control Law violation - 1, Firearms and Gun-powder Control Law violation - 5, and 53 others. During the same period Formosans were involved in the following cases; larceny - 2, mass-assault - 1, intimidation against officials - 1, and assault against officials - 7; while 42 Chinese were involved in cases of sedition and 1 in intimidation.

"According to the 72 survivors who arrived at Sasebo on Jan.30 the repatriation ship 'Ebisu-Maru' 100-ton motor-sail boat with a crew of 10 Koreans, was stranded and sunk instantly about one mile off the coast of Chinnampo, on Oct. 29, 1946, fully laden with Japanese repatriates from the Antung Zone while navigating from Rogampo to Jinsen of North Korea. Approximately 497 returnees out of 567 were lost. "

"Several hundred Koreans boarded the ship, left the port on 30 September 1946, and safely landed at Fuzan. As the ship was about to set sail for Japan, six or seven Koreans came aboard, struck the captain, took documents, and forced the ship to enter a certain harbor between Toei and Sanzenpo (Ex: Southern Korea). The ship hasn't been seen since. I have already reported the matter to the Occupation Forces. I would appreciate your assistance in locating this ship..."

HEALTH: 300 KOREANS DIE WHILE IN JAPANESE JAIL

Writer states:

"My elder brother, CHANG In Soo, went to Japan by a smuggling ship. He was caught at Hakata, Japan, and placed in jail. I went to Hakata with food and clothes for my brother, but the police official would not permit me to see him. They told me that the stow-a-ways had an epidemic."

"Later I read in a newspaper that the stow-a-ways were sent back to Korea. I felt better, but on the 20th of October I read in the paper the names of deaths in the jail epidemic. Among these names was CHANG In Soo, my brother. I wanted to go to Hakata to see if it was my brother, or someone else with the same name, but the Korean People's Union in Japan advised me not to because the death rate was three hundred. They told me that the Korean People's Union would investigate the matter."

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
